## **A New Presence: Philosophy of Coexistence with Nature**

We will not save our species by a new narrative, return to the old ethical systems or choosing the most promising idea from the supermarket of secular and religious ideologies. To survive we need something far more radical: a new type of human presence on planet Earth. We need awakening, at the level of rudimental being in the world, a basic intuition, that we are part of the greater process of life.

The lecture introduces the notion of open-source intelligence, connection with which brings us peace, clarity of thinking and wise action (without excess or deficiency). On the practical side the lecture shows how to intelligently combine attention with reflection in times, when the climate disaster makes us rethinking our place in nature.
